

INVESTIGATING COLOURED PENCILS
WITH JACKIE COX
MONDAY 13 – TUESDAY 14 JULY 2020

What will you learn?

Coloured pencil has recently made a big comeback both for adults and children. There are many types of pencil and finding the right ones for your own artistic style will help set you onto a new path of exciting creativity.

On day 1 we will investigate dry coloured pencils, both wax and oil types and on day 2 water soluble types of pencil.

Each day we will use the pencils in various ways on different papers available experimenting with the many diverse effects you can achieve with each.

Who is your tutor?

Jackie inherited her talent for art from her grandparents, both of whom were freelance illustrators, so she was always drawing from a young age. When Jackie left school to become an animal nurse at a veterinary practice in Margate, she found that the overnight patients made marvellous subjects and she started doing animal portraits. Jackie had her first exhibition in Tewkesbury in 1981 and since then she has shown work around the UK and abroad, she has exhibited regularly with the Society of Feline Artists, the UK Coloured Pencil Society (silver signature member) the National Exhibition of Wildlife Art and the Society of Wildlife Artists. She is fortunate to have won a number of awards which have spurred her on to further experiment in new mediums, concentrating even more on light, shadows and nuances of colour"



Jackie moved to the Forest of Dean in 2003 and was asked to take over a local art class where she found that her interest in trying out different mediums and surfaces allowed her to be able to help and encourage others. Jackie enjoys teaching and alongside her own weekly classes has done many and varied workshops.

Are there any additional costs?
